

# Seeking Public Health Professionals for N2PH Project Community Advisory Teams

## What is the N2PH project?

The **New to Public Health (N2PH) Project** is an academic–practice collaboration between UW–Madison and public health professionals in Wisconsin, that seeks to adapt an existing public health nurse residency program for rural areas and to all public health professionals.

## What are Community Advisory Teams (CAT)?

Two teams of 10–12 public health professionals from local, tribal, and state health departments with diverse perspectives and professional backgrounds interested in advising the N2PH project.

## Who can participate?

Any public health professional with experience and interest in exploring application to:

- Rural health departments
- All public health practice disciplines

## What are my responsibilities if I participate?

- Prepare for meetings by reviewing materials and residency content
- Actively engage and share perspectives during team meetings

## What should I know about the meetings?

- Meetings will take place online (WebEx)
- Meetings will occur six times over three months
- Meetings will be no longer than 90 minutes
- Meetings will be approximately every other week, starting mid-October 2019

## What are the benefits to me?

- Help strengthen public health practice in Wisconsin and beyond
- Opportunity for leadership, partnership, and professional development
- Those selected to participate will receive \$25 for each meeting attended, totaling up to \$150
